







A multitude of events during 2017 have significantly changed the outlook on local, regional, Arabic, and international stages. KFCRIS must always keep pace with such changes in order to fulfil its objectives of raising national, intellectual and cultural awareness.

To do so we have continued on our path of scientific and cultural leadership. Thanks to our wide network and extensive experience KFCRIS has published several strategic studies and special reports and staged a full program of conferences, seminars, and workshops focusing on these new realities and their consequences. We have also strengthened ties with international research centers engaged in the same areas of study and recruited leading researchers in these fields.

The spirit of King Faisal was present throughout KFCRIS's 'Al-Faisal — *Witness and Martyr*' exhibition in Astana and Almaty in the Republic of Kazakhstan this year, having previously visited Al Jouf, and several other Saudi cities.

In a year of many important cultural and scientific events, KFCRIS has successfully staged 12 lectures and seminars and organized seven conferences and 13 workshops and discussions. We have also conducted more than 40 cultural, scientific and research visits, translated 75 pieces of



research and published over 30 political and research studies and eight miscellaneous publications. We have also participated in four exhibitions and run two training courses at Al-Faisal Institute.

KFCRIS has also been prominent in several high-level political and international events, including the organization of the 'Riyadh Forum on Countering Extremism and Fighting Terrorism' under the sponsorship of the Islamic Military Counter Terrorism Coalition. The theme of the forum was the "nature of extremism and the future of terrorism", underlining Saudi Arabia's leading role in the fight against terror regionally and internationally.

Subsequently, KFCRIS organized its annual Islamic Political Thought Conference which this year was entitled 'Makkah and the Hijaz in the Imperial-era: Migrations and Scholarly Networks in the 19th and 20th Centuries' and was attended by an elite of Saudi and global academics and subject experts.

The years also witnessed the inauguration of Al-Faisal Museum for Arab-Islamic Art by HRH Prince Faisal bin Bandar, the governor of Riyadh, in the presence of HRH Prince Sultan bin Salman, president of the Saudi Commission for Tourism and National Heritage and HRH Prince Turki Al-Faisal, chairman of KFCRIS.

The specialized cultural periodicals we produce, however, remain at the heart of what we do. Throughout the year we continued to produce research publications, strategic studies, course materials, lectures, commentaries, special reports, our *Al-Faisal* cultural and scientific magazines, and linguistic studies publications. Additionally, we were able to broaden our reach by establishing book fairs and publishing houses and extending library services to tens of thousands of researchers. This report details all library-related activities including cataloguing, restoration, indexing, and the digitization of our collection – the realization of our efforts to migrate to web-based services, thanks to the KFCRIS IT department.

KFCRIS is a truly integrated, collaborative body: to talk about KFCRIS is to talk about each component part, its interests and its objectives. Without doubt, much of that mentioned above has come about because of our approach of manning our departments with appropriately qualified nationals boasting in-depth experience in their specialist fields. This has been a necessarily brief introduction to a full and fruitful year: in the following pages we offer more detailed activities that we hope will act as precursors to an even more successful year in 2018.

KFCRIS was established in 1983 to take on the mission of the late King Faisal of sharing knowledge between Saudi Arabia and the rest of the world. It was conceived as a platform that brings together researchers and institutions to safeguard academic works, to produce and publish research, and to enrich the cultural and intellectual life of Saudi Arabia. KFCRIS also acts as a communications bridge between east and the west. Its board of directors is led by chairman HRH Prince Turki Al-Faisal and secretary-general, Dr Saud Al-Sarhan.

Offering in-depth analysis of current political issues, Saudi, North-African and Moroccan, Iranian and Asian, political economy and Arabic language studies, KFCRIS cooperates with eminent research institutions and leading researchers worldwide. It boasts a broad network of researchers in a diverse range of specializations, operates a visiting fellowship program and curates an extensive collection of rare manuscripts. Its key focus is to broaden the availability of relevant literature and research material combining both historic and contemporary literature about the contribution of Muslim communities to humanities, social science and arts, and to to bring them to the forefront of academic debate.

KFCRIS facilities include the King Faisal Library, the Islamic museum and the King Faisal Memorial Hall.

Riyadh Forum on Countering Extremism and Fighting Terrorism

Held in Intercontinental Hotel Riyadh on 21st May under the sponsorship of the Islamic Military Counter Terrorism Coalition, the forum underlined the Saudi policy of pursuing international accord to counter terrorism and promote peace and security based on the Kingdom's religious and moral responsibilities. The event was inaugurated by HRH Prince Turki Al-Faisal, chairman of KFCRIS, and attended by global experts in extremism and counterterrorism. Al-Faisal Museum for Arab-Islamic Art

On June 1st HRH Prince Faisal bin Bandar, the governor of Riyadh inaugurated the Al-Faisal Museum for Arab-Islamic Art in the presence of HRH Prince Turki Al-Faisal, chairman of KFCRIS, and HRH Prince Sultan bin Salman, president of the Saudi Commission for Tourism and National Heritage.

The museum showcases KFCRIS's collection in two halls; the first displays rare pieces of Arab-Islamic art, the second manuscripts and copies of the Holy Qur'an, including the exhibition "Masahif Al-Amsar" which presents an assorted collection of Qur'anic manuscripts of diverse origin including several ancient and rare examples.

Both the Islamic art and manuscript collections illustrate patterns of movement and trade between Islamic communities across the ages. The objects on display include exquisite works of ceramic, pottery, glass, metal and wood dating from the 2nd to the 14th century Hijri.





KFCRIS comprises seven academic units:

Saudi Studies Unit

Specializes in the study of the historical traditions and culture of the lands that make up contemporary Saudi Arabia, with a focus on archaeology, historical anthropology, and sociology, together with the study and documentation of oral history and poetry, with a special focus on the Nabatean civilization. The unit focuses on heritage predating the unification of the Kingdom in 1932, and that predating the First Saudi State (1744–1818). The unit also occupies itself with archaeological and anthropological heritage studies regarding historical cultures, peoples, and societies in the Arabian Peninsula in general, including pre-Islamic ones.



Asian Studies Unit

With a focus on the cultural, social, political and religious aspects of Asia and Asian communities, the unit was formed to meet the increasing need for research at a time when Arab-Asian engagement is both increasingly complex and potentially rewarding. The unit aims to promote greater awareness of Asia and Asian communities in the Arab world, to enhance the quality of academic and media discussions, and inform government policy on the region.

Iranian and Persian Societies Studies Unit

Focuses on the academic study of modern Iranian politics, international relations, energy security, intellectual history and culture, and their broader significance for the history of the region, as well as those of other Persianate societies. Given Iran's geostrategic position in the Gulf and its many contributions to statesmanship and scientific learning, a comprehensive understanding of this country is indispensable to grasping regional dynamics. The unit endeavors to draw upon the latest theoretical and methodological approaches offered in the disciplines of political science, sociology, history, economics, philosophy, and anthropology for the study of modern Iran and to publish research findings in these fields.

Arabic Studies Unit



Dedicated to research, teaching, training, and innovation in the field of the Arabic language, the unit addresses the learning and instruction of Arabic in Arabic-speaking societies and Arabic as a second language for western learners. The unit studies and produces literary critiques as well as writings related to the subject of the Arabic language. The unit emphasizes collaboration with linguists of various East Asian languages to enrich language references for Arabic and East Asian languages.

Contemporary Political Thought Studies Unit

Studies the rise of contemporary political thought and its influence on the political structure of Islamic and Arab societies by researching ideas and movements currently shaping the political scene. The unit encourages an interdisciplinary approach encompassing theory, politics, culture, society, and religion so as to provide a broad understanding and clear analysis of the development of political thought and movements in Islamic and Arab societies.







Maghreb Studies Unit

Concerned with North Africa in general and the Arab Maghreb in particular, research spans geopolitical, political, cultural, social studies and regional developments. The unit focuses on the study and analysis of the shifts in the region and on presenting assessments of the changes, phenomena, and future of Maghrebi regimes and societies. It analyzes trends in sociopolitical arenas and monitors internal and regional conflicts, tracing their sources and consequences.

The former Energy Studies Unit was merged into the new organization.



During the year a total of 663 posts were uploaded to Instagram where we have 1,841 followers. Content, primarily images and ads, generally mirrored Twitter content.





Museum Department

Museum

The Museum Department manages and cares for collections at KFCRIS through documentation, conservation and storage of art and historic objects.

The Arab – Islamic art collection consists of over 700 objects dating from as early as the 2nd century AH up to current date, and represents the various geographic regions and historic eras of the Islamic world. The King Faisal Memorial collection is made up of modern historic objects that memorialize the life and accomplishments of King Faisal Al Saud and consists of roughly 800 items including costumes, medals, furniture, documents and personal items. The coins and currencies collection includes roughly 2000 objects and is comprised of two groups: the Queen Effat collection, and the KFCRIS collection.

The department organizes exhibitions in accordance with KFCRIS objective of raising awareness and understanding of the late King Faisal's heritage and his contributions towards preserving Arabian and Islamic heritage. In 2017 a primary focus has been reopening KFCRIS gallery spaces and improving the level of curatorial care devoted to the collections.





Museum Department





Activities in 2017:

- Completed and inaugurated the Al Faisal Museum for Arab Islamic Art and the opening of the Masahif Al-Amsar Exhibition of written and printed Qur'anic manuscripts, including the preparation and conservation of objects for display, the renovation of display cases and galleries, and the printing of exhibition brochures.
- Refurbishment of the manuscripts section including the installation of a new fire
 extinguishing system, setting up humidity and temperature data loggers, installing UVresistant curtains to protect the manuscripts from harmful light, as well as ceiling and
 lighting repairs.
- The purchase of tools and equipment for the conservation unit including a stock of Japanese hand-made paper, humidity detectors and a manuscript acidity measurement device.
- The launch of a new collection to record and preserve the history of KFCRIS.







Alfaisal Institute for Human Resources Development

Al-Faisal Institute for Human Resources Development

Al-Faisal Institute for Human Resources Development, a subsidiary of KFCRIS was established in 2000CE with the main mission to fulfil the vision of the late King Faisal that 'Saudi Arabia becomes a wellspring of radiance for humanity'.

It's contribution to public education and training mirrors KFCRIS objectives, while its organizational structure reflects its role in promoting societal responsibility, Arabic language, and the promotion of Arabic and Islamic culture and humanitarianism.

The institute is committed to training young people in preparation for joining the labor market, and to the training and professional development of KFCRIS staff. Rather than limit itself to a fixed curriculum or staff, it adopts appropriate courses as needed and contracts specialist instructors from within Saudi Arabia and abroad as associate lecturers as needed, who are augmented by a team of full-time teaching staff employed by the institute.

A central focus of Al-Faisal Institute is pioneering the teaching of Arabic to non-Arabs. It is also committed to enabling Arabs to achieve full social integration through basic business and life skills training, and the promulgation of Saudi culture to all residents of the Kingdom.

The institute has produced three books according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) as a resource for learners of Arabic as a second language. These books are designed to help learners build up their understanding and develop an indepth knowledge of the Arabic language, from characters, to words, to linguistic structures. The books' structures help students delve deeper and explore more complex issues as they progress.

A second set of volumes is in preparation. These will include conversational Arabic for medical practitioners and several vocabulary glossaries each of 100 words dedicated to specialisms such as commerce, medicine and diplomacy, and a collection of Arabic folk stories to help students progress from elementary to more advanced levels of language.

- Reprinting all issues of Al-Faisal 2017 (six issues and six books) into one hard cover volume for Jeddah International Book Fair.
- Planning content and layout for both hard copy and electronic editions of 2018 issues.
- Appointing a five-strong expert panel to oversee content and write introduction to the 40th anniversary commemorative issue.

Darat Al-Faisal

Darat Al-Faisal





Darat Al-Faisal is an electronic archiving project begun in January 2011. An initiative of HRH Prince Turki Al-Faisal, the KFCRIS chairman, Darat Al-Faisal was conceived as the chief source of information about the late King Faisal both inside and outside Saudi Arabia. The Darat aims to collect everything related to this field of study in whatever format and is committed to digitizing and preserving all such material and making it available to those interested in the life and achievements of the late King Faisal.





Darat Al-Faisal Archive

The first stage of this complex project aimed at preserving the heritage of King Faisal has been successfully completed at a cost of approximately SAR765,000. This includes:

- The archiving of 20 videos of King Faisal's speeches, rare TV interviews and press conferences have been restored and archived. This included extensive color correction, montage processes, and the addition of graphic introductions explaining the historical context.
- Archiving of 15 recorded interviews and radio speeches of Al-Faisal, after advanced processes to clean
 and balance sound quality, remediate the effects of aging, and appending by detailed explanations of
 each speech or interview.
- Restoring and archiving 155 rare pictures of King Faisal. These were subsequently posted on social media channels.





Al-Faisal Scientific Magazine





The first issue of Al-Faisal Scientific Magazine was published in June 2003 with the aim of keeping pace with scientific and technological developments and to enable all levels of Saudi society to have a basic understanding of science and technology issues.

Marking the next stage in the magazine's development, in March 2009 KFCRIS signed a cooperative agreement with King Abdulaziz City for Sciences and Technology (KACST) since when the magazine has been published quarterly in hard copy and electronic formats.



Al-Faisal Scientific Magazine



Content

- Overseen by a dedicated editorial team that continually updates content and design, Al-Faisal Scientific Magazine includes articles on a diverse range of scientific topics from contributors from throughout the Arabic and Islamic worlds. It also includes translations of specialist articles previously published in American and European scientific publications, especially those written in English and French.
- Each issue has a primary focus on a current topic which will be of most interest to the dedicated readership. Topics are selected based on the scientific interests of readers and by keeping abreast of scientific research and new discoveries, with due consideration given to issues which would benefit from rigorous scientific analysis. Specialist contributors enrich each issue, while scientists are encouraged to send their suggestions and feedback.
- Scientific development is explored in the regular Wahat Al-'Ulom (Science Park) section, while heritage is discussed the regular Meshkat Al-Turath (Light on Heritage) section, under the guidance of Dr Dahham Al-'Ani, chairman of the magazine advisory board.





- Deepening ties with the King Abdulaziz City for Sciences and Technology (KACST) by continuous communication with its staff, collaborating on each issue, and distributing copies of the magazine there.
- Signing a partnership agreement with Princess Noura bint Abdulrahman University, Riyadh
- Media sponsorship of February's Cancer Aware Nation (CAN) campaign, with the magazine honored at the closing ceremony at King Faisal Specialist Hospital and Research Centre.
- Participation in the World Arabic Language Day held by King Saud Medical City on 18th December.


